Faculty and Staff News

Mark Johnson will appear with Secretary of State Kris Kobach at 12:15 p.m. Sept. 10 at the KU School of Law to talk about voter identification issues. The event is sponsored by the law school's chapters of the Federalist Society and the Hispanic Law Students Association.

Jammie Johnson hosted a table at AEJMC's Graduate Recruitment Expo in San Francisco along with assistant professors Peter Bobkowski, Joseph Erba and Hyunjin Seo and graduate students Jessica Casebier and Roseann Pluretti.

An interdisciplinary research team led by Assistant Professor Hyunjin Seo and Fengjun Li (computer science) presented a peer-reviewed research paper, "Trust-Aware Review Spam Detection," to the IEEE International Conference on Trust, Security and Privacy in Computing and Communications on Aug. 21 in Helsinki, Finland. The other authors include Hao Xue and Roseann Pluretti, Ph.D. students in computer science and J-School.

Professor Barbara Barnett's article, "Dividing Women: Magazines' Framing of Trafficking for Sexual Exploitation," has been published in Feminist Media Studies.

Barnett's article, "Apologia and Rape: How the U.S. Military Framed Two Cases of Sexual Assault," has been accepted for publication in Media Report to Women. Barnett's co-author was Nadine Billgen Hoffman, a KU alumna and assistant professor at Marist University.

**Barnett** has published “The Babe/Baby Factor: Sport, Women, and Mass Media,” a chapter in the Routledge Handbook of Sport Communication.

**Associate Professor Yvonne Chen** has been elected chair-elect for the Lawrence LiveWell Tobacco-Free Living work group. The goal of this work group is to advocate for tobacco-free policies to benefit Douglas County residents, and it is currently working on advocating for the expansion of the Lawrence Clean Indoor Air ordinance to include e-cigarettes.

**Chen** was co-author of a paper titled "Using Teach-Back to Understand Participant Behavioral Self-Monitoring Skills Across Health Literacy Level and Behavioral Condition," which has been accepted for publication in the Journal of Nutrition Education and Behavior.

**Professor Chuck Marsh's** article, “The Strange Case of the Goddess Peitho: Classical Antecedents of Public Relations’ Ambivalence Toward Persuasion,” appears in the current issue of Journal of Public Relations Research.

The Pontifical University of the Holy Cross in Rome has invited **Marsh** to speak on communication ethics at the 2016 International Church Communications Seminar in Rome.

**Assistant Professor Jonathan Peters** has been re-elected as teaching chair for the Law and Policy Division of the Association for Education in Journalism and Mass Communication.

**Peters** spoke last week at the Frito-Lay plant in Topeka about digital security and privacy. He is also speaking Tuesday in Kansas City at the monthly meeting of the International Association of Business Communicators. Peters will discuss press freedom problems in Ferguson, Missouri. He also will discuss those problems in September at the Kansas City Press Club.

**Peters** has been quoted recently on First Amendment topics by several news outlets, including The Huffington Post, Editor & Publisher, Nieman Lab, and Litigation News (published by the American Bar Association).
